From the Pastor's Desk

We Gather Together!

At long last, this Sunday, February 10, we will dedicate our new building at Cunningham. How do we plan to use it? It will be a place where:

- Children gather to learn about Jesus in Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. Where they gather to play while parents take a night out for themselves.
- Youth gather to hang out, watch a movie, eat pizza, while learning what it means to be disciples of Jesus Christ.
- Adults gather for Sunday School, Bible Study, yoga classes and other small group studies.
- People can gather to explore nontraditional styles of worship.
- We all can gather after our worship service to share coffee and swap stories, and where we can gather for just about any reason to break bread together.
- United Methodist Women gather for fall bazaars, bake sales, Granny's Attic to raise money for mission.
- United Methodist Men gather to prepare barbeque, baked beans, coleslaw and other meals in order to send our kids to summer camp.
- Friends and families gather, after a funeral, to share memories of loved ones who no longer are with us.
- Where we gather to hear musicians such as Chip Richter share their art and craft with us and with our friends and neighbors.
- Friends and families gather to celebrate the birthdays, weddings, anniversaries, and other milestones with those we love.
- Real people sharing common struggles gather to share, support each other, and find strength for the journey. (We hope to host a weekly meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous soon).
- People who care gather in mission to pack shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child, pack school kits, health kits, birthing kits and flood buckets for the United Methodist Committee on Relief, and meals for Rise Against Hunger.
- Friends gather for sock hops to collect socks and raise awareness of the plight of the homeless.
- People on a mission gather to dream, plan, evaluate, launch and celebrate our work for the kingdom of God.
- Other area United Methodists gather to exchange ideas on ministry and mission (one such meeting is already in the planning stages).
- ... (the list could go on and on!)

On the one hand, our building is simple—four walls and a roof. It's made up of simple materials—2 by 4s, plywood, shingles, bricks and mortar. The miracle is what happens inside when people gather together. Jesus said it himself: "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20, NIV).

We may come up with a more elegant name for our new multi-purpose, education/fellowship hall/kitchen building. But I doubt that we will come up with a more accurate description of what will take place inside.

So I invite you to come and gather with us at the Gathering Place! We will dedicate our new Gathering Place on Sunday, February 10, immediately following our 9:30 am worship service. A light lunch will be served. Come gather with us!

4. **Worship Committee Chair:** We are increasing the size of our Worship Committee as we take on the task of planning and offering alternative forms of worship in the "Gathering Place" even as we continue our traditional worship. We need a chairperson who is vitally interested in worship to lead this group.
5. **Prayer Team Chair:** We have several dedicated people who have volunteered to be part of a prayer team at Cunningham, but the team needs a leader.

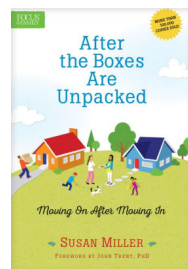

Growing as Disciples at Cunningham

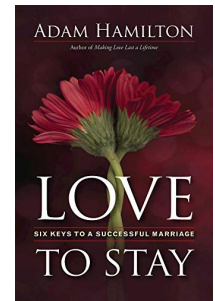

Special Session of the General Conference

The Council of Bishops has called a Special Session of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church to be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri. The purpose will be to act on a report from the Council of Bishops based on the recommendations of the "Commission on a Way Forward." The 32-member Commission was appointed to examine paragraphs in The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church. Pastor Tom & Carol Announce their Retirement Plans

On February 3, Dee Dee Kent, on behalf of the Staff Parish Relations Committee, announced that Pastor Tom plans to retire from full-time parish ministry on June 30, 2019, the end of the current conference year.

In his follow-up letter to the congregation, Pastor Tom said that this difficult decision was made only after months of discernment and prayer. "I am thankful because God has given us the privilege of living and working among you for the past ten years... I see exciting times awaiting Cunningham in its ministry to the people of Fluvanna County."

Pastor Tom and Carol plan to split their time in retirement between their home in Midlothian (where they can continue to spoil their grandchildren) and their cottage at Lakeside, Ohio.

Pastor Tom also is planning to continue offering a ministry of spiritual direction. In preparing for this one-on-one form of ministry, he will be enrolling in a program at the Shalem Institute of Washington, D.C. The Staff-Parish Relations Committee has met with District Superintendent Danny Kesner to discuss the process for appointment of a new pastor. They will be reporting to you as this process unfolds.

Pastor Tom and Carol ask for your prayers as they enter this new phase in their lives. And they promise to continue to pray for the people of Cunningham. May we all remember at all times that we are Children of God!

FINANCE – Walter Hussey

- We have drawn \$50,000 on our construction loan to help pay Alexander Nicholson's November invoice. The balance of \$30,971.45 was paid from the Building Fund. We will request subsequent draws to pay the remaining approved Alexander Nicholson invoices.
- VANCO, our electronic giving service provider, is requiring us to adopt an Information Security Policy by the end of January. The Financial Secretary has obtained a template and drafted such a policy for CUMC which is being reviewed by the Finance Committee. The Council unanimously authorized the Finance Committee to approve an interim CUMC Information Security Policy.

TRUSTEES – Mark Liles

- Construction work on the Gathering Place is a couple of weeks behind due to weather delays but we still are looking at a January completion date. During the week of Jan 7, porches and soffit work on the back of the building were completed. Final grading was started included the burying of the propane tank. Final grading should be completed next week, weather permitting, in preparation for pouring the concrete for the basement mechanical area, ramp and slabs for the heat pumps. Painters have been onsite completing some of the remaining painting on the interior and will also begin the process of completing the exterior painting. Most of the kitchen equipment is onsite and the AN team is installing these components. Crutchfield will be onsite in the next week to install Audio Visual equipment.
- In late December of 2018, Cunningham received a letter from United Methodist Insurance stating we needed to pay \$1,939.23 by the end of 2018 for our 2019 liability coverage (which represented 25% of the annual premium) and \$3,566 in January 2019 for our casualty coverage, a total of \$11,322. UMI did not provide any policy documents with coverage details. This is more than 3 times our 2019 Insurance

budget estimate for the **combined liability and casualty** coverage of the existing and new buildings. In response to recent increases in the United Methodist Insurance Company's premiums and lack of coverage transparency, we are seeking pricing from several other **liability** and **casualty** insurers. The Finance Committee will continue to work with the Trustees to identify sufficient, reputable and comprehensive liability and casualty coverage for our church buildings, ministries, and associated people.

UMW – Linda Merhar

- UMW will meet Tuesday for a business and organizational meeting for 2019. In February and March we will be hosting speakers and inviting all women to attend. Announcements of the speakers will be coming soon.

MISSION OUTREACH – Mary Kalchbrenner

- Parent's Night Out will begin on February 2 from 4-8 pm.
- Collection for needed food items for Meals on Wheels Emergency Food bags will take place the last two weeks of January.
- March 2 from 6-8 pm will be a Sock Hop in the Gathering Place for all ages and open to the public to enjoy music and collect socks for the homeless.
- Feb. 18 – possible work day to the Central Virginia Hub to help pack kits.

STAFF-PARISH COUNCIL – DeeDee Kent

- The Staff Parrish Relations Committee completed and signed the recommendation and emailed it to the District office today, 1/10/19, the due date
- We are also tasked with completing the Church Profile on the Virginia Conference Website. We completed updates and we are in the process of filing them on the Conference website.

PASTOR'S REPORT AND CONCERNS:

- Pastor Tom discussed the importance of reaching out and connecting with God and the people of Fluvanna. We are experimenting with using "Connection Cards" to provide better ways for individuals to share information with the church and provide an additional ministry of prayer.

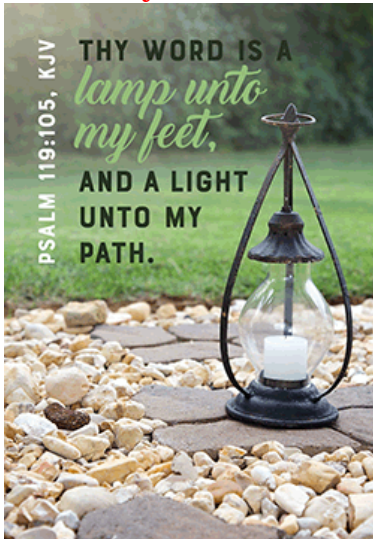
